Knowing the inherent risks and rigors involved, I certify that I am fully capable of participating in the Wilderness Inquiry ("WI") activities and that I wish to do so as a voluntary participant. In consideration of WI providing the Activities, I hereby release any claims for personal injury or property damage against WI (and its agents, employees, directors, officers, and volunteers), arising out of ordinary negligence. I also release such claims arising out of any act by anyone not under control of WI. This release of liability may not apply to any incidents occurring on lands administered by the National Park Service. I give permission to WI and involved program partners to use photographs and video for promotional purposes. I have read, understand, and accept the terms and conditions stated herein and acknowledge that this agreement shall be effective and binding upon me during the entire period of participation in Wilderness Inquiry activities. This agreement is governed by the laws of the State of Minnesota without applying its choice of law provisions. If any minor children will be accompanying me, I make the same certification and provide the same release on their behalf. - Rain jacket
- Jacket or sweater
- Shoes that you are willing to get a little dirty
- Water bottle
- Baseball cap or other brimmed hat to protect you from the sun and rain
- Small day-pack or dry bag to hold your belongings

Optional Items:

- Sunscreen, lip balm, sunglasses
- Camera in a plastic bag to keep it dry

Note: You won't need cell phones, iPods or other electronic devices. If you bring them, consider putting them in a plastic bag to keep them dry.

Trip at a glance:

Wilderness Inquiry (WI) staff will greet you at the meeting place. WI staff will then prepare you for whatever activity you will be doing with important instruction and safety tips. If this is a water-based trip, everyone will wear a life jacket or Personal Flotation Device ("PFD") during the entire trip. If you are not comfortable with swimming, no need to worry—the canoes are safe and your life jacket will protect you.

Participants are expected to follow the WI rules and behave in a respectful manner toward each other, staff and other people on the river or trail.

If this is a water-based trip, you will travel in 24-foot handmade Voyageur canoes. Each Voyageur canoe holds 6-10 paddlers. They are very stable boats, and they move quite fast when paddlers work together. These boats are designed specifically for trips on big or moving water.

This is an outdoor event, so you may have rain, wind, and hot or cold weather. It can be significantly cooler on the water than on land, and temperatures can change throughout the day. Be sure to bring clothing appropriate for these varied outdoor conditions.

After the trip or activity, we will gather together to share thoughts and reflections on the experience. Then it's time to drive home and tell your friends!
